Several women from Elim's Adult Services program are serving mothers – and earning a valuable paycheck – by providing childcare services for a Mothers of Preschoolers (MOPS) group in a local church.

While there, the women work alongside church volunteers to provide loving care, help with crafts, and assist with Bible stories. Most of the adults from Elim have been matched with this opportunity because of previous babysitting experience or a love of children.

Roseanne Bultema is the job coach overseeing this partnership and has been excited at the results. "Both sides have benefited from this experience," Bultema offers. "Individuals from the churches have repeatedly expressed how much they love the ladies from Elim and have enjoyed establishing relationships with them. Everyone's excited to start the program again this fall!"

Ministry Highlights

January 2010

- Elim adults respond to Haiti earthquake by assembling 10,000 food packs, 6,000 hygiene packs, 2,000 school packs, and over 8,600 rice & bean packs.

February 2010

- Board of Directors commissions 5-year-plans for Educational Services, Adult Services, and Discovery/Ministry Outreach.

- Elim hosts *Called to Serve* event, joining hundreds of people around the belief that God has a kingdom mission for people with disabilities.
- Elim's ABLE project (providing staffing support through internships) chosen for project replication by Intersect for Ability.

- Elim partners with Hope Alliance to distribute school packs in the Dominican Republic and establish ministry outreach partnership.

Elim's Adults Aid Earthquake Survivors in Haiti

July marked the six months since the tragic earthquake in Haiti. When the earthquake hit, several of Elim's adults had recently embarked on an Elim HOPE Pack mission trip there.

Upon hearing the news of the catastrophe, Elim's adults immediately went to work. Gifts flooded in to support this valuable work. Over \$65,000 was raised to send HOPE Packs to Haiti and this money was then matched by a generous donor!

These gifts translated into 10,000 food packs and 8,640 rice & bean packs for Haitian individuals desperately in need of this support. Each food pack is filled with enough supplies for six meals. Additionally, Elim's adults have packaged 2,000 school supply kits and 6,000 hygiene kits that have been shipped to Haiti where they will be distributed by a local Christian relief organization.

Elim's adults are hard at work packaging more food packs filled with red beans and rice. Through Elim HOPE Packs, they're thrilled to know that their hard work is bringing joy and hope to children in Haiti!

Adult Services Awarded Exemplary Rating

In December 2009, the Adult Services Elim HOPE Packs program was awarded a rare and prestigious "Exemplary" rating by the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF). The surveyors commended Elim and noted the impressive partnership Elim has developed through local churches and organizations.

CARF praised the positive impact created by Elim HOPE Packs, including the provision of meaningful paid work opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities, promoting acceptance of individuals with disabilities within our community, creating numerous partnerships that expand opportunities for our adults, and enhancing cultural diversity through the mission trips and visiting missionaries.

Last year, Elim's adults celebrated being named Wilton's #1 vendor for the second consecutive year! Despite that honor, Elim's adults soon lost much of that work to a cheaper vendor. Sadly, this situation is not isolated, as throughout the past decade, many subcontracted packaging opportunities have been lost. In order to best serve Elim's adults and continue to offer them vocational training and opportunities, Elim Adult Services is changing its programming to a broader vocational and skill training program. Glorifying God Overseas

As you read this report, the Elim HOPE Packs program continues to grow. Perhaps the most important aspect of Elim HOPE Packs is that it equips people with disabilities to do kingdom work – which is exactly what they were created to do.

Through Elim HOPE Packs and its partner ministries, three of Elim's adults recently traveled with Elim staff members to Peru and the Dominican Republic. Elim's adults distributed HOPE Packs and participated in mercy activities throughout their time there. When Mimi wiped the face of a young child, she was used by God to bless that child. When Gale assembled a school pack with Danillo, she was a co-laborer in God's kingdom.

The outreach trips benefit the adults in practical ways too. First, adults like Gale and Mimi are able to connect what they are doing in their daily work with the recipients of God's mercy. It helps them really understand that their work is impacting the lives of those around them. They also return from their trips with a passion that spurs on the rest of Elim's HOPE Packs team to keep serving. They encourage their workflow colleagues in doing something that is important, reminding each other to be thankful for God's providence in their lives. Even their self-esteem, such a vital issue for so many people with disabilities, is affected in positive ways.

Through their participation, these adults live out the fact that they are valued and created by God to respond to His call to serve others!

One School's Discovery Center Makes a Difference

Jacob had a hard time letting his teacher know when he didn't understand the day's lesson. Eventually, he fell far behind his classmates, testing at a third grade level when finishing fourth grade. His family turned to their school's Discovery Center for help.

Now, after just a few months of daily tutoring, Jacob has caught up with his classmates. While the Discovery services will always be available if he struggles in the future, this spring he is expected to no longer require special help and will receive his reading lessons alongside the rest of his fifth grade classmates.

New Discovery Centers Added: New Discovery programs were added this year at DeMotte Christian School and HOPE Protestant Reformed Christian School. Through these and other such programs, hundreds of students will be able to receive academic assistance and tutoring within their own Christian school.

Agencies Join Forces to Serve Seniors

Last year, Elim and nine other agencies joined forces under the name "Intersect for Abilities" to share information to better serve individuals with disabilities. This year, Intersect for Abilities worked together on the GRACE Project, which organized information that related to how individuals with developmental disabilities experience aging and can best be served. This information will be presented at the National Q Conference in New Orleans.

Brad Johnson, Director of Adult Services, recently explained how this program will benefit Elim's senior adults. "As Elim's adults age, they often have an earlier onslaught of aging disorders than the general population. Their need for additional mental, emotional, and physical supports are increasing dramatically. This, coupled with dementia, is really stretching staff to adequately meet their needs. Additional information and staff training are crucial in addressing the many different issues facing Elim's senior adults."

Currently, Elim serves 28 adults in its Seniors' program. In order to enjoy their golden years, the Seniors' program allows them fewer work hours and places more of an emphasis on social and recreational opportunities. A number of other non-senior Elim adults have also been diagnosed with dementia. The information gathered through the GRACE Project will be an invaluable guide to help Elim and other organizations best serve these individuals.

INTRODUCING INTERACTIVE METRONOME

Elim's Discovery Center added yet another tool to their arsenal this year with the addition of Interactive Metronome. Interactive Metronome is a brain-based training program developed to directly improve the processing abilities that affect attention, motor planning, and sequencing. This, in turn, strengthens motor skills and many fundamental cognitive skills such as planning, organizing, and language.

Dedicated residential services staff, in partnership with Elim Christian School, continue to devote themselves to each child who calls Elim's campus their home away from home.

Katie Spratt is among those children. Katie came to Elim's residential program after her parents concluded that they could no longer meet her many social and behavioral needs. Because of their efforts and the support of Elim champions, Katie has developed more appropriate social skills such as table manners and the ability to interact with her peers in various activities. Her behavior has improved greatly, allowing her greater social experiences both on campus and in the community.

Katie's mom, Jackie, agrees. "The staff has gone over and above in providing a nurturing environment for my daughter. Without them, I don't know where Katie would be today. My family is so thankful for each and every one of them."

Jackie is also grateful for generous people who have championed her daughter's needs by supporting Elim. "Anyone that's ever donated time, money, or just a loving thought or prayer on Elim's behalf is a very, very special person. Thank you very much for supporting Elim and the outstanding work they do for our children."

Elim's Staff Committed to Excellence

Anthony Learns Skills at Local Preschool



Anthony Forde loves kids! And, with his new position as an assistant at Southwest Chicago Christian School's preschool, he's able to learn valuable skills while having fun!

An independent worker, Anthony is beneficial to the preschool because he is able to jump in wherever needed. His responsibilities vary each day – helping the kids with activities, cleaning up after

snack, or assisting the teacher. Anthony's help allows the teaching staff to spend more individualized time with the kids. The children also benefit from their positive interaction with an individual with a disability. Especially because of their young age, this experience will help them develop positive memories and break down any future barriers.

Anthony is also learning important skills during his time there. His independence has grown, he's having fun, and he is learning responsibility. As he continues in Elim Christian School's vocational program (STEP), Anthony will also have more placements in other vocational settings to help him identify his skills and interests. Elim's staff hopes this is just one experience that will help him discover what he would like to do following his graduation.

Elim Residential Program Update: As students graduate and move out of the residential program, the program continues to downsize. Ultimately, this process relieves continuing financial pressure on the Elim community. In the last four years, Elim's residential program has gone from 28 to 16 residents. Please pray for the residents and for our dedicated residential staff.

First ACE Games a Huge Success

This year, 83 children and 8 adults came together for the first "ACE Games." The ACE Games were intended to offer a celebratory athletic-type experience while catering to the specialized needs of children and adults with autism. Individuals were able to participate in 35 sports, athletic, or sensory games. There was little music, background noise, or waiting – all frequently difficult circumstances for individuals with autism.

Anna Quist, one of ACE's recreational therapists, was excited to see how positive the experience was for those who participated. She said, "We wanted to provide an event where they could celebrate their talents and abilities with their families. We expected it to be a good day, but we were still overwhelmed by how positive the experience was for the participants."
