

*How Elim's Crossroads program helps guide families
through the maze of transition*

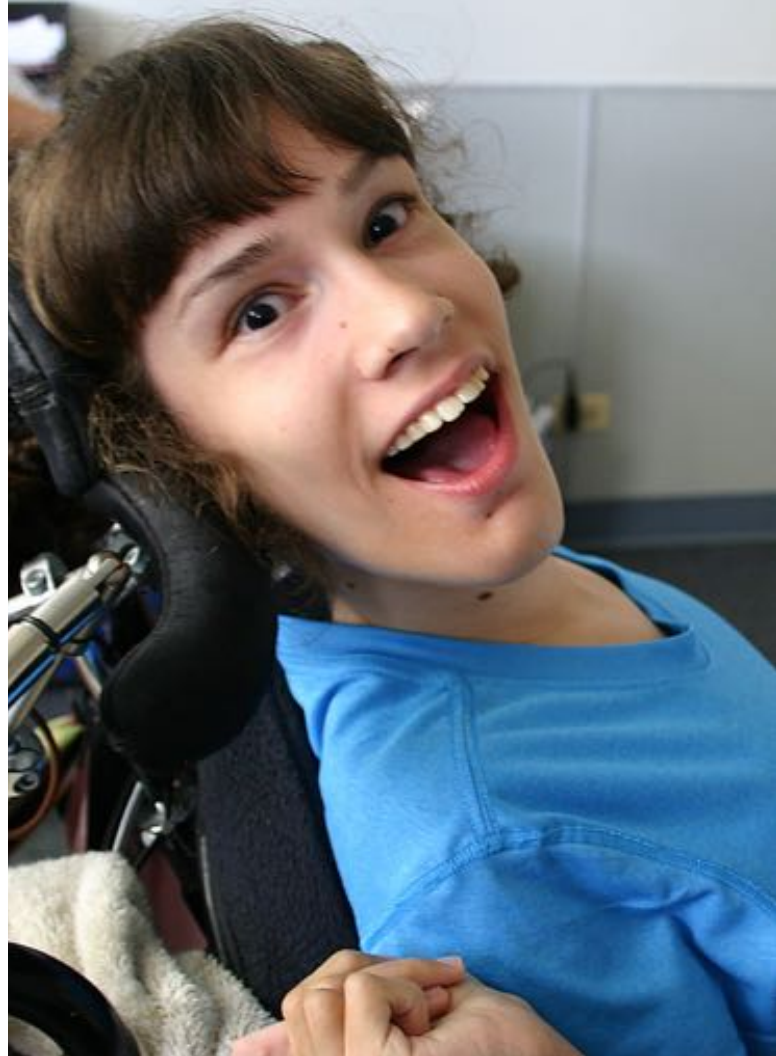
High school graduation always signifies big changes ahead. For Elim's students, though, high school graduation comes with some huge and complicated transitions. State funding shifts. Adult day programming and residential options become new possibilities, and the process can be a great challenge to families. Already-weary families are stretched further.

Elim founded the Crossroads program to provide extra support and help for families and students approaching this pivotal time. Crossroads students spend their days participating in vocational training and lifeskills education to help them determine what path to follow after graduation and better prepare each student for life after they leave Elim. Our staff helps evaluate interests and increase capabilities to simplify the road following graduation. Support is also provided to Elim's families to help them cope with and better understand the insurance, agency, legal, and financial decisions they will face.

The Crossroads program is just one more way Elim serves the families of our students. Your gifts make this program possible. Thank you!

Celebrating the Elim difference

Elim Christian School is unique in so many ways. Our teachers work closely with parents and caregivers. In each Elim classroom you'll find a wide scope of needs and abilities. For example, in one classroom, a teacher works diligently to meet the individual needs of each of her students, including one with deafness, two who are blind, one who requires nourishment through a g-tube, and another who is catheterized.

Our teachers know the value and capability of their students, despite their special needs. The teacher of this diverse crew explains, "Don't think for a minute that these special needs have stopped us. This class makes cards and art for people who are hurting in the community. We go to the post office and stamp envelopes ourselves. They even know us at the fire

station. I think of these students as my kids. I need to get them ready to be out in the world. It's amazing what they can do!"

Because each student is special, Elim provides individualized instruction and therapies to meet each student's diverse needs. Not only do students learn about God and His creation, but they also have tailored access to literacy programs, specialized autism programming, a therapeutic pool program, assistive technology, adaptive P.E., and a wide variety of social and recreational opportunities. Meeting the individual needs of each student – mind, body, and soul. That's the Elim difference.

Frequent community outings bolster lasting friendships and allow opportunities for our adults to continue growing in independence. Elim provides safe transportation, supervised shopping trips, restaurant visits, and recreational outings in order to help our adults enjoy life to the fullest. Elim's adults volunteer at local organizations and also witness to church congregations through our Worship Team, blessing all those who surround them and demonstrating the value of individuals with disabilities.



ACCOMPLISHMENTS (cont'd)

SPRING 2013

Elim forms a work team to assist ministry leader Maddy Manden in development of special education teacher training for country of Rwanda.

Elim welcomes over 500 participants in the third annual Eagles' Wings 5K, and hundreds more to our annual Fine Arts Festival.

Eight churches participated in our first ever church-wide Military Kits campaign. Elim adults send Military Kits to seven locations around the world.

SUMMER 2013

Middle school graduates 22, high school graduates 17.

Adult Services reaches a client base of 220 adults, the most in its history.

Elim outreach team travels to Nicaragua to strengthen relationship with local ministry leaders and share education expertise.

Elim car shows hosted by Schepel Buick and by Scott's Garage raise almost \$25,000 for HOPE Packs, Adult Services, and the school program.

Elim Adult Services

Promoting lives of significance

Elim's Adult Services program seeks to provide more than basic care for our 220 adults with disabilities, striving to promote meaningful relationships and assist our individuals in creating lives of significance.

Adult Services enables our adults to build a portfolio of meaningful experiences in many ways. Through Elim's vocational program, our staff assesses each individual's skills, abilities, and interests in order to best pair them with their "perfect fit" of daily activities. Dozens of adults are employed in the community, and most adults participate in meaningful work through Elim HOPE Packs or Elim Military Kits. Through these two programs, our adults discover the joy and self-esteem that comes through transforming the lives of others.

A wide variety of educational opportunities are also available for Elim's adults. Not only focused on academics, our staff offers training in life skills, finances, and even computer skills. The adults also participate in fitness programs, with individualized classes and modifiable equipment being readily available to help each participant stay healthy – body and soul.

Elim's Adult Services program was awarded a prestigious exemplary rating by the Commission for Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities (CARF) this year. To learn more about Elim's distinctive Adult Services program, visit www.elimcs.org.

Autism Services Expand

Elim's autism programs grow with rising rate of autism

Since 2004, Elim has been on the forefront of providing the most up-to-date services in our autism programs. It's staggering to note that the CDC now estimates that one in every 50 U.S. children will be diagnosed with autism. Autism rates have risen 23% since 2006 and 78% since 2002. In the midst of such overwhelming statistics, Elim exists to bring hope to families touched by autism. Elim answered the call to provide specialized autism services to children through our ACE program and adults through our ACTS* program. The programming and facilities of these programs are tailored specifically for the needs of individuals with autism.

Autism instructor Nicole Spangler explains why the programs are so effective in serving individuals with autism. "Individuals with autism really benefit from knowing what each day will hold for them. Techniques like pictures, visual aids, and physical structuring are used to help reduce anxiety, thus increasing happiness! We look at the existing strengths and skills of each person that we serve, then we try to build on them."

Our staff anticipates the need for continued expansion of our adult autism program as autism rates continue to increase and those diagnosed with autism age. Please continue to pray for wisdom and guidance for these important programs.

International Outreach

Shining our light for all to see...that's the Elim difference

Too many individuals with disabilities worldwide have no access to special education services. Too many communities remain ignorant of the potential and value of individuals with disabilities. Too many parents need the training and support that Elim provides.

At Elim, we believe God has called us to share our knowledge, expertise, and resources with those who need it, even if that need is on the other side of the world. We know that through the process of working with others, our staff grows in knowledge and can better serve individuals with disabilities on our campuses as well.

Through our outreach program, Elim international ministry leaders provide resources and training to special educators worldwide. These educators, then, are empowered to teach others the techniques and strategies that they have learned.

Currently, Elim has relationships with ministry leaders in India, Rwanda, Nicaragua, Zimbabwe, and Thailand. Each July, they gather on Elim's campus for an International Outreach Summit. During this time, they share their challenges and successes, strategizing together for greater global impact.

Elim Discovery Program

Helping students succeed with specialized learning programs

"God made them able to learn in a special way, so that's how we should teach them." Those words, spoken by a Discovery Center teacher, sum up the unique philosophy of Elim's Discovery Centers.

Discovery Network Services serves students with learning challenges, allowing them to stay within their local Christian school. Providing academic assistance, testing, and referrals, Discovery Centers provide students with the individual methods and encouragement that each student needs to succeed.

Students often see more than just a boost in their academic scores as a result of their time in the Discovery Center. With classroom success, students also experience increased self-esteem and confidence as they start working at their full potential.

Elim's knowledge is spread exponentially, allowing Elim to serve even more individuals with disabilities throughout the world and teaching our staff members more about global special education needs and resources.
