AUGUST:

Nearly 9,000 HOPE Packs were assembled by Elim adults and distributed to local children in need.

Laurie remembers her parents sending her to school many years ago. She said they didn't have the means to support her and thought school would be the best thing for her to do. "It was kind of scary for me at first," Laurie said. "I didn't think I would like it. I didn't think I would fit in. My mama sat me down and said, 'Relax, it's going to be okay."

That is when she came to Elim. And Laurie's mom was right after all – everything was okay! During her years in the school program and in the Adult Services day program, Laurie learned many different things and made many lasting friendships.

One of those things is learning different skills and jobs through Elim's work program. Laurie said, "I liked counting cardboard because it was the easiest job." Now she is looking for employment in a restaurant or in dog grooming, because she loves animals.

Throughout her years at Elim, Laurie developed and grew in her faith. Laurie knows that God is her Savior and that he is guiding her through every day. She believes that God has a plan for her life now and in the years to come. "I think **ELIM IS A GOOD PLACE** to support people with disabilities. They help you know that **YOU DO HAVE THE ABILITY** to go out in the world and work and do the things you want to do without criticism and without judgment. I just think that Elim is something good for a person with a disability."
